Doe Lea, Chesterfield, Derbyshire.

Terrain: Historic parkland around Hardwick Hall with ancient woodlands and wildlife-rich fishing lakes. Magnificent views.

Car parking and Assembly: 8 Miles SE Chesterfield at Visitors (overflow) Car Park, near the Hall.
Free for NT and English Heritage Members (Remember to have your cards scanned) £4 for non-Members.
Follow the brown tourist information signs from M1 J29 via A6175.
NB A Sat Nav may take you along narrow roads that are in the area.

Registration: 10.00 – 12.00 **Start times:** 10:30-12:30

Courses: Suitable for Novice and Experienced with help and advice available.
White, Yellow, Orange, Light Green, Short Green, Green, Blue, Brown.
A string course will be available.

Entries and fees: Entry on the day only.

Adults on Light Green, Short Green, Green, Blue, Brown courses:
£7 (members of British Orienteering); £9 (non-members)

Adults on White, Yellow, Orange courses: £3.50

Children and Students: £3.50 **String Course or Maze:** free

Family £17.50 (members of British Orienteering); £21.50 (non-members)

Family groups with a Child on White, Yellow or Orange will pay £3.50 for one map and can purchase additional maps for 50p

Please include your British Orienteering membership number on your registration form.

Timing: This event will use Sportident electronic punching and feature contactless punching for SIAC cards, though other SI cards will work as normal. SIAC cards will be available to hire at the event on a first come first served basis for a fee of £2. E-card hire is £1 if you do not have a Sportident card.

Dogs: No dogs on courses. Dogs on a lead in the car park / assembly area.

Map: Updated 2018 to ISOM 2017 standard by Mike Godfree
Scale 1:10000 and contour interval 5m.
Courses will be pre-marked on waterproof paper.

Safety: Competitors take part at their own risk, but all reasonable care has been taken by the Organiser and Planner to ensure their safety and well-being by addressing the risks identified in the Risk Assessment and the planning of the courses. Whistles are advised. Full leg cover is required.
The courses may cross parkland which may have grazing cattle.
All competitors must report to download even if they retire. Courses close at 2.30 pm, after which controls will be collected. You must still report to the download even if you miss the cut-off time to avoid a search.
