ENTRY DETAILS

Who can take part ?

Schools do not have to be members of the British Schools Orienteering Association to enter.

The event is for pupils in years 5–13 inclusive but note that it is the pupil's date of birth that determines the class they enter not their school year.

This is a Schools event and all entries must be made through your school.

Competitors should have competed in at least three orienteering events at the appropriate standard before the Schools Championships.

The full 'Competition Rules' can be seen at www.bsoa.org.

<u>Terrain</u>

The area is a mixture of open parkland with deciduous, gently contoured woodland. There is an extensive path network.

Parking, Assembly, Facilities, Finish and Starts

Minibuses and cars are expected to be on hard standing within the area. This is 'pay and display' payable on the day. Buses will be parked a short distance away, roadside in a small industrial estate, after dropping off their passengers. The finish will be in the assembly area, there will be ample room for tents. The starts will be a 5 minute walk from assembly.

Map and Control descriptions

A waterproof five colour map at 1:10,000 overprinted with the controls plus control descriptions. One blank map will be sent to each school with the final details.

Cost and Entry Details

All entries to be on the enclosed form. There is a £6.00 entry fee per School. There is an entry fee of £6.00 per pupil (ie £12 for a pair) for entries posted no later than **FIRST CLASS on Tuesday 22nd October** (ie for most, finalise entry list before half term) and **£7.00 for entries posted after that but last date for posting is FIRST CLASS on Wednesday 31st October**. There is no late entry (after 31.10.13) or entry on the day.

Equipment Required

Personal gear needs to be either orienteering kit or a T-shirt or long sleeved shirt, tracksuit bottoms and trainers (or good grip soled shoes). No Shorts or Jeans. Should weather conditions dictate, cagoules will be made compulsory. It is possible the area could be muddy.

A compass and a whistle are strongly recommended.

SI Control Punching

The SI electronic punching system will be used. Each competitor (or pair) will be issued with an SI card at the pre start. The hire cost of the SI card is included in the entry fee. Only issued SI cards can be used. A demonstration control will be available on the day near Enquiries for those not familiar with SI.

School Categories

We would recommend that you consult the full rules which are on the website at www.bsoa.org To help with your entries a simplified flow chart is included at page 15.

Pupils may run in a pair in years 5-8 only. They will have a map each, but only one SI card. If a pair comes from different years then they must be entered as the higher year. If they are not the same gender then they should be entered as boys. *Pairs must stay together and cross the finish line together*.

Awards

Awards will be given to the first 3 individuals in each age class, first 3 teams (of 3) in each age class and the first 3 schools in each category of school.

Certificates will be awarded to all competitors.

<u>Trophies</u>

Trophies will be presented to the winning school for each age class and the winning school in each category of school.

Timings and Prize Giving

The intended start period is from 10.00 to 12.00 dependent on number of entries. Prize giving should take place at 1.30 pm in the assembly area.

Accommodation for night of Saturday 16th November



British Schools Orienteering Championship Flow Chart – School Categories

The following refers to pupils in the school, not just those entered for the event. Again, year groups refer to the normal d.o.b. ranges in English schools so any school which doesn't conform to those year groups should match their age range to the corresponding classes on the entry forms and then refer to the chart below. Therefore, for example, Scottish primary schools would normally fit into the Middle School age range. See also the notes below the chart.

Schools should enter the "Whole School Team" as follows:-



Where a School or College does not conform to the guide above, then the school should enter the "Whole School Team" competition in a category appropriate to the general classification of the school, and in the spirit of the competition.

In the event of any uncertainty as to which "Whole School Team" category to enter, please contact the Organiser, who will attempt to resolve the matter. If a school and the organiser cannot agree on the correct category to enter, then the matter will be referred to the British Schools Orienteering Association whose decision is final.

NB A school may only enter TWO "Whole School Team" Categories if they have pupils in years 5 or 6 AND years 9 or above.
