ROCKY KNOLL in THE SIGN OF THE SPORRAN PART IV

THE 1991 DVO SUMMER LEAGUE

It's back! Bigger, better, even more confusing, and this year there's real prize! Yes, two big silver cups for the man and woman who by some strange quirk of the scoring system, become SUMMER LEAGUE CHAMPIONS. Mike Gardner and Christina Wright defend their titles. The whole of Derbyshire holds its breath.

To remind (or initiate) you, Summer League Events are held on Friday evenings from April through to July. They start at 6.30 pm, although you can usually turn up at any time till 7.30 pm and get a run. There will be a small entry fee to cover the cost of the map.

the emphasis is FUN, not necessarily conventional orienteering. The main course each week should test your orienteering skills in some way, but be prepared for anything? There will also be a shorter/simpler course for younger children.

The scoring system this year will be as follows:

MEN: 12 points for 1st place, 10 points for 2nd, and then 9,8,7......down to 2 points for 10th place. Everybody attending receives at least 1 point. WOMEN: 6 points for 1st place, 4 point for 2nd, then 3 and 2 points for 3rd and 4th. Again everyone attending receives at least 1 point.

However, there's more! A handicap system applies which penalises whoever is leading the league at a given moment in time. The following percentage handicaps apply for the leaders.

MEN Leader 36%, 2nd place 30%, then down in 3% steps to 6% for 10th place.

WOMEN Leader 36%, 2nd place 24%, then down in 6% steps to 6% for 5th place.

Anyone who organises and event automatically gets 12 points. So you can see, it's quite simple!!
