Editor's Bit

Another month, another BOF Committee Report, this time tampering with JK Relay classes. OK, not so earth-shattering as the Working Party on Fixtures Structure but the JK Relay Classes are a bit of a mess - there were no less than 27 classes at this year's JK with every combination under the sun (literally so in Cornwall's tropical conditions). The JK Trophy now vies with the JK International Trophy, those of less tender years can choose between M/W60+ or Senior BOF Ages >125, and somewhere in there are such oddities as the Mixed Length Ad Hoc. With each member of each team in the first three getting a mug, there must have been over 250 to give out - and I still didn't get one.

Technical Committee's proposal is to replace this mish-mash with just 12 classes, JK Trophy M and W, International M & W, M & W 120+, M & W 165+, M & W 48-, M/W12-, Ad Hoc.

Without getting into the Elite v the Rest debate again, this does seem to leave the numerical majority of orienteers older than M21 with just 1 competitive class in practice, the 120+ (does this mean 120 and over, or over 120, which excludes a 3 x 40 team?). Assuming the former, I can't get worked up about a competition that might pit three M40s against an M35, an M45 and an M50. At least under the present regime, the club that wins the M40 class knows that it has arguably the best M40 runners in the country. Winning a 120+ class is fairly meaningless in comparison.

I would get rid of the International class, which seems to me to exist only because otherwise no British Club would win any prizes, and runs the same courses anyway. If you wanted to acknowledge British inferiority, you could award a separate prize to the top British team. I would keep M35, and amalgamate M40 & 45, M50 & 55 and then have an M60+. I would amalgamate W35, W40 & 45 (this is not sexist; numbers do not justify a separate W35 team-few clubs can raise one) and have W50 & 55 and W60+.

For juniors, I would endorse the mini relay M&W12- and keep Open 14- & 18- and W14- & 18-, not to mention Mixed Length Ad Hoc, which has always struck me as a meaningless but necessary class to cater for those not up to their own age relay class or who simply can't find two other club members to fill an age class team.

That makes 15 relay classes by my reckoning, a massive simplification of the existing 27, admittedly more than the 12 proposed, but this is reductio ad absurdum.

By the way, I was very impressed with the speed with which the JK Results were sent out, barely two weeks after the event had finished - a record? The plaudits are only slightly tempered by the difficulty in making head or tail of the individual performances in the relays. They've chosen to list everyone by what course they did, not by what class they're in. I'm sure the organisers of the British this year won't make that mistake.

CLUB CHAMPS '97

The Club Championships is very much a tradition for DVO and this year's is no exception. I am told that even the change to a Saturday fixture is only a reversion to an earlier tradition. The Club Champs is an event for every member. Because you are allocated a start time by handicap based on recent performances every competitor has a chance to win. The most important tradition, of course, is that the winner has to organise the event the following year and your entry implies that you accept this possibility. Tradition also demands that previous winners are unlikely to win again and so Steve Kimberley has agreed to start a new tradition by controlling this year's event. The event is being held on the new northern extension of the Longshaw map which so far has only been used for the Junior Inter-Regional in 1996. However, don't fear if you have seen that map, hopefully the 1:10000 scale blow up will be ready in time, though those few adults who ran after helping last year may find it counting against them. So, you can expect some challenging orienteering on this area combining fast open and the intricate woodland below the old stone quarries.

The event is being held on Saturday 14th June, entry is free (treasurer permitting) on the form below, but note that it is pre-entry only so as to calculate your handicap and overprint enough maps. The short course is for children up to M/W14 inclusive and is roughly of Orange standard. The winner of that course will be awarded the trophy presented to the club by our Lithuanian visitors a few years ago. The medium course of roughly Green standard is intended for the 16's, older men, most women and less experienced competitors. The long course of Blue/Brown standard is intended for most of the men and those women who would normally run Brown. The winner of these two courses receives the magnificent Chris Yardley trophy of Derbyshire calcite(?). Start times will be from about 2:45 to 3:30 with the start times calculated according to handicap so everyone finishes around 4pm - first across the line is the winner. We have decided not to retreat to a village hall but instead assume the weather will be fine so you can eat your own picnic tea. Parking at the Surprise View car park on the north side of Longshaw (grid reference 254802 on the A625) with the start and finish just across the road (take care crossing the busy road, especially with children).

The handicapper reserves the right to change you to a more appropriate course.
