SPORTS SCHOOL NURTURES STARS OF TOMORROW



PLANNING for performance is now widely recognised as an essential element in the drive for excellence in sport.

The Midland School of Sport has taken the message on board - not only will the organisers be aimling to develop skills at Keele University from July 19-24 but also give a framework for tuture development in planning nutrition, mental preparation and training cycles.

This year's School will have 110 participants representing seven sports - cycling, girls basketball, netball, girls football, orienteering fencing and squash.

The 21 coaches have already met for an "education" day at Loughborough, which enabled them to plan Imaginative programmes. The National Coaching Foundation has also contributed to the programme to ensure that coaches are using current best practice.

Sponsored jointly by the Sports Council East and West Midland Regions, the School is led by Regional Officer John Palmer and administrator Pauline Prior.

Commented Dr. Palmer: "We hope " that participants will improve their skills during the week but the main aim is to give them a framework and an approach to sport which will stand them in good stead for the future.

"That's why we are concentrating on the 14-17 years age range, which is the time when those who are going to make it to the top need to start systematic training programmes."

The most recent success story from the School of Sport is Dave Godfree from Mickleover in Derbyshire, who has been selected for the British team for the World Junior Orienteering Championships in Finland.

Runners gather with maps at the ready

THE CRACK troops of map and compass racing are advancing towards the Cumbrian fells for one of the greatest events of world orienteering. Bigland Estate, 1,200 windblown acres of moor. mountain and forest, is the venue for Britain's major international gathering, the JK Festival, which runs from April 17:20

JK Festival, which tons and April 17-20.

More than 4,000 competitors from 12 countries will take part. The first two days will be marked by a series of individual events. On the third day — Easter Monday — club teams of all ages will compete in a series of relays sponsored by The Daily Telegraph.

These events include the blue riband competitions of the weekend — the JK Trophy for senior club teams in which each team's four members each run an 8 km section.

For the past three years the men's event has been won by a Swedish club, OK Tyr, but this year the Swedes face a hard battle from leading British teams which include Sheffield University and South East Lancashire.

Frank Rose, 62, from Romiley, Cheshire, is the co-ordinator. He and his wife, Kath, took up orienteering some 20 years ago. He says: "We caught the bug from our children who were both keen competitors."

When Frank and Kath strode their first course there were about 5,000 orienteers in The orienteers are congregating in Cumbria, writes Alan Bennett

Britain. Now the number has doubled and is rising steadily.

Rose describes the sport as:
"Cross country, point-topoint racing with map and
compass, each competitor
finding his way around a
series of control points by the
fastest route."

The Scandinavians are masters of the art. The JK Festival takes its name from a young Norwegian, Jak Kjellstrom, who encouraged the sport in Britain and who was tragically killed in a car accident.

The chief planner of this year's course is Tony Pennick who lives in St Bees, Cumbria, works in the energy industry and has a reputation a "hard man".

Rose chuckles: "It is going to be real up-and-downer, a genuine stamina sapper which should not be taken lightly by anyone from the soft South or anywhere else for that matter."

He has been actively involved in organising the event for two years.

Like so many of his fellow enthusiasts, Rose is mustardkeen. He says: "There is a fascination in the achievement of competing against yourself and the course, pitting your wits and physical strength against the terrain, the elements and the wiles of the course planner."

the course planner. The influx of competitors, families and friends into Lakeland has posed a huge accommodation problem. Apart from a YMCA centre and rooms at Bigland Hall, schools, hotels and guest houses have been taken over. The Bigland Hall estate.

The Bigland Hall estate, near Newby Bridge, which looks out over high peaks and across Morecambe Bay, has recently changed ownership.

Richard Bigland, aged 52 and member of a family that has lived at the estate since 1161, found that increasing costs had made it impossible to maintain.

He was one of the first estate owners to introduce diversification with a riding school, holiday flats, clay pigeon shooting, archery and angling. The new owners are farmers, Mr and Mrs Geoffrey Holines from Bridlington, Humberside.

Rose says that the Holmeses have given a great deal of support to the festival.

There were worries at one stage that arrangements might have been harmed by the sale. But all's well that ends well and the Easter weekend at Bigland will echo to the sound of grunts, puffs, squelching running shoes and much applause as the map and compass brigade — aged-10 to 70—try to find the shortest distance between numerous points.


DEAR ED.
