SCOTTISH BANDIT MAKES A RAID ON THE PRIZES !!!

This year, the SLMM wasn't in the Lakes but instead was on the Howgills, with mist over the hills for most of the weekend. There were DVO members in most classes from Scafell (Elite) to Harterfell (String). Most classes had 70 to 100 starters apart from Scafell which had about 20.

It was on the Harterfell class that a Scottish bandit from the Campbell clan & his long suffering partner decided to make a raid on the trophies. "I've never done one of these before" was his excuse for entering the Harterfell despite coming near the top of his class in the Karrimor last year.

Starts were between 8.00 & 9.30, & by the time we started, Alex & partner were on the home straight, chasing that line of string through the mist. Needless to say, his team was second to arrive at the overnight camp, several hours before everyone else on the ... how should I put it ... rather more demanding courses.

Bad weather courses were in force on day 1 so everyone dropped down a course. For us in the Bowfell class this became 24.5km from 27km, by the straight line route - realistically this meant 30km.

We had decided to follow "Jubby's good guide to eating on the move" & got some marzipan mixed with raisins, washed down with isotonic orange. It sounds gross but tasted great, not that I'd consume it as a snack between meals at any other time though.

We had a good first day with a little lost time for navigation errors & one bad route choice, but lay 16th overnight in a time of just under 6 hours. DAVE CLOUGH'S SURFBOARD FOUND IN HAWAII

Two weeks ago a young beachbum called Ivan O'Map on one of the smallest of the Hawaiian islands was wandering along a white coral-sand beach fringed by palm trees, looking for interesting debris cast up by the ocean in the wake of Hurricane Eva. Suddenly his eye lighted on a smart white surfboard half buried by wet sand. After digging around to lift it free golden haired Ivan saw painted on the board the words DAVE CLOUGH - DVO.

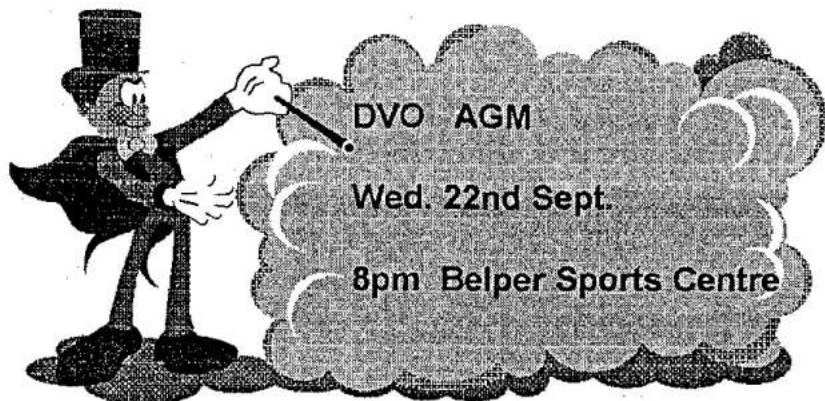

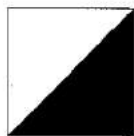

- > Tied places are awarded equal points but the next place points only 1 less e.g. Shipley Park Men: 1,2,2,2,2,3 etc.
- > Points in each event are reduced by a handicap of 2.5% for each point won in the previous event.
- > Event organisers * receive 10 points with no handicap applied.
- > All results are shown rounded to the nearest whole number but decimal places are carried through in the spreadsheet (which is why some of the rows do not appear to add up correctly).
- > The Cromford result is shown only if at least one other Summer League event has been entered.
