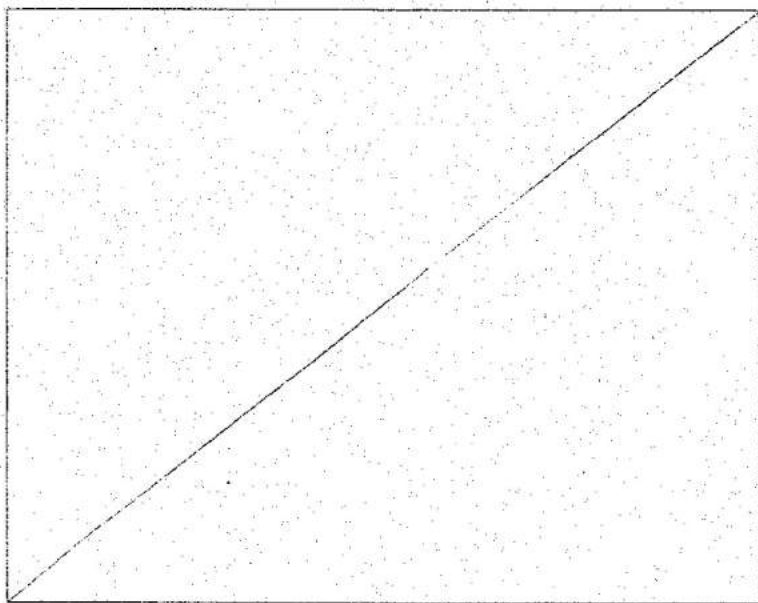

### A WEEKEND AWAY

I was very surprised to receive a letter selecting me to run for England in the Ward junior home international especially as David had been running better than me in the recent National Events. The weekend started with 3/4 of a day off school! But a long boring minibus journey soon dampened our spirits.

Southampton Youth Hostel was not good either, the temperature inside was colder than it was outside. The warden kept assuring us it was just about to warm up.

We arrived at the individual event at 10.10 and at half past I was informed that I had the earliest start time at 11 o'clock. With rather hurried preparation I was about to dash off to the start when I discovered the starts had been delayed by 1/2 an hour. I was lucky to set from the start in the right direction and quickly found my bearings. It was a tricky map to read at first and on the way to number one I had to slow down frequently. Generally there were paths to follow, good attack point, and catching features. Apart from one minor error and a few dithers I had a reasonable run and came 5th and 1min 30 down. I was the 3rd English counter and found myself in the relay team. The relay race was short and fast having 11 controls in 2.5km. I took 15 mins and was the fastest English. Over all we won all the relays except for the M17. We also won the team trophy.

## CROESO 88

By general acclaim this "Welsh 6 Day" event was one of the outstanding successes of the 1982 O calendar. The article in the last issue of Compass Sport does it justice but as very few DVO members were there perhaps a few recollections of the high and low lights will add to the flavour.

The main success of the week for a DVO member went to Ian Finlayson who won National Event 5 M13A at Ogof Flynnon Ddu and Pant Mawr (how evocative the Welsh sounds). Ian was duly presented with his Red Dragon in a bizarre ceremony in Lampeter's derelict car park next to the Rotary Club Sheep Roast. It was pouring. Only six Orienteers turned up, two of whom were certain prize winners, a pair of Swedes were trying to argue. Wish Gdula had a van load of Red Dragons to give away. It lasted about 10mins. Ian went on to come second on Green in the aggregate 4 day colour coded event and a 6th place Gold Standard at the terminal badge event at Crychan Forest.

Other notable DVO results were Alex Campbell's 7th place in National Event 5 and Crychan. Heidi Dickinson came second in NES 15B and Douglas Dickinson's best result was a gold standard 13th place in H40 at Crychan.

Ogof and Pant Mawr saw perhaps the hottest day of the Summer which took it's toll of many including myself, but I got to know Ted Smith of DVO as we sociably struggled around the baking limestone pavements. This event was also memorable (!) for the six mile dirt road drive into and out of the area.

Day 2 at Pembrey was also scorching but the planners had imaginatively located the finish on the beach with miles of lovely surf to cool off in.

Day 3 on Plynhmon was different and for me, an occasional fell runner, the most enjoyable run of the week. The fast runnable open hillsides were a delight, too bad you had to look for controls. Glasfynydd was the pits, (depressing), much worse than Strines for brashings and the J.K. for windblow. Halfway Forest and Crychan were only marginally better but quite challenging in their way.

The organisation was splendid even though the prompt results service faltered at the end of the week. Organisers and impressarios wish Gdula and Hag Harvis were everywhere but mainly in the King's Head. Ethnic entertainment was lavishly laid on by Local Ladies, Male Voice Choirs, harp playing witches etc.

There was even a mid-week fun run round the streets of Lampeter. Breakfast time deliveries of sumptuous rolls and pies were laid on for the campsite and the meals at the King's Head washed down with pints of Samson ale were all one could want to round off the day. If they do organise another CROESO I hope it achieves the standard set by this first one - and perhaps there will be more DVO members there.

### OPEN MEETING 3/3/89

Notice is hereby given of the DVO Open Meeting to be held on the 8th March 1989 at Ripley Leisure Centre. It will commence at 8pm after a training run/swim at 7pm.

All DVO members are welcome to attend either the run/swim or the meeting or both.

The following notes are extracted from the Minutes of the Open Meeting held on 14th December 1988 at Alfreton Leisure Centre which was attended by 23 members.

Social Events - A very informal, social sub-committee has now been formed. Its

members being Chris Pollard, Graham Johnson and Debbie Wilkinson.

Please approach any of these three with ideas for events. Chris put forward a couple of ideas that have already arisen.

Canal trip - This would last 2-3 hours starting about 19.00 and cost about

£2.50/head, assuming that we can fill a boat, (40-50 people). There is a bar on board and food is also available. Chris has agreed to get a couple of dates which can then be fixed at the next committee meeting. Other events?- Bowling was generally accepted as a good idea and is to be fitted in at some stage. The club champs/entertainment now seems to be a fixed feature, we need to find a suitable village hall type venue for this.

Steve Buckley raised the idea of a club weekend, perhaps for a badge event in The Lakes or North Wales. Helen Stratford said she had just attended such a weekend with AOK and they had used a closed Youth Hostel. (As in the EM coaching weekend in February.) With regard to using a Youth Hostel it was suggested that we wait to see how the EM weekend goes. A club social weekend would have to cater for children. It was pointed out that many club members are going to the Scottish 6 day and that this was quite a social event, thus perhaps we should be looking long term to FEBRUARY 1990. The idea really is to treat the Saturday as a day out and then attend an O event on the Sunday. National Event IV in Wales was then proposed and accepted as a suitable target weekend. So the 10th and 11th of June it is! All we need now is a suitable club campsite!!

Any Other Business.

Expenditure Plan- Dave Nevell suggested that as we now run the club by committee, with a new constitution, we should have some sort of expenditure plan for the committee to base decisions on. For example we could consider buying a new club tent, subsidising coaching and/or professional mapping of areas. This led to a more general discussion on mapping. Roger Wilkinson was asked by the fixtures sub-committee to determine the cost of professional mapping. We currently have several areas which need more work or totally redrawing; Linacre, Lea Woods, Bretton Clough, Eyam Moor, Calke, Kedleston, Cromford, Whitesprings and Hardwick.

Bretton Clough may qualify for a Sports Council grant as it is a new area. (The EM mapping fund is currently empty!) We currently have two very experienced mappers in the club, Roger and Tony. In answer to the question, whether money should be spent on professional mappers or

training up new mappers within the club, it was explained that Roger Wilkinson feels that before a good map can be drawn the individual must be a competent orienteer. But Chris Pollard pointed out that unless people are given a chance to try they will never discover how good/bad they are. Dave Oliphant has offered to do a mappers training weekend for each club, it seems that this offer should be accepted. Judy Buckley feels that we need to produce more club mappers, first maps could be revisions of old maps rather than new drawing- perhaps the club should invest in some more equipment to help new mappers. Judy added that drawing is as time consuming as surveying. Steve Buckley said that he felt there should come a point at which we should have reasonable maps for each area, the contours, ground and point features should not vary too much. But it was pointed out that ground features do change, e.g. depressions vanish! Mike Gardner feels that if we wish to hold a badge event at Bretton Clough we are running out of time and perhaps a professional mapper should be used. He reminded the meeting that the Sports Council do provide grants for the improvement of the quality of the sport. This may apply to remapping of some areas, e.g. Linacre, as it is fairly urban. Andy Thomson will find out at the next EM meeting what the position is for grant application to map Bretton Clough, Cromford and Linacre, as it is certainly worth trying for grants. Perhaps some capital could be raised for mapping by getting money up front on map sales, eg. from the council. The next couple of months will be the prime time for this as government funded organisations will be trying to allocate their whole budgets before the year end. As maps are obviously a priority at the moment the club should pursue all avenues of finance and also introduce more club members to surveying. We are getting to the point with mapping where we will have to get some tenders done, if this occurs club mappers should certainly be allowed to submit their own tenders. It would certainly be interesting to hear Roger and Tony's views on payment for mapping. (Steve Buckley pointed out that if we started paying club members to map it would become more difficult to get voluntary organisers, planners, etc)

#### Radcliffe-on-Soar Power Station

Despite initial sound interest in this trip, only 6 people to date had confirmed their intention to come along. It is therefore with regret that I have had to cancel on this occasion. Are there are a lot of apathetic club members out there or are we, the Social Committee doing something wrong? I hope that any other arranged trips receive a better response, otherwise there really is no point in having a Social Committee.

The aim of the weekend is to survey our new Badge Event area of Bretton Clough and Eyam Moor. Ground survey of the Clough is needed and checking of the photogrammetric plot of the Moor.

It is hoped that all mappers of some experience will attend and any novices who want to help out by shadowing the "experts" are also welcome.

The mapping will be co-ordinated by Roger Wilkinson and Tony Thornley and we have arranged for Terry Foxton of OD to draw the map for us ready for the Badge Event in November. It is hoped that Peter Roberts of Roberts Mapping will also assist in the training of some of the mapping team.

The Youth Hostel is large and we have the use of a room for all the day. Families are welcome to come along and either assist the mapping or enjoy a social weekend in beautiful surroundings. The full cost of the weekend including meals is £10 per head but this should be reduced by grant aid from BOF and DVO.

I will be phoning club members who have expressed an interest in mapping but feel free to contact me if you wish to attend either of these courses.

By way of preparation for these mapping exercises we shall be showing the BOF video on mapping at the next Open Meeting in March at Ripley Leisure Centre at 8pm. This will follow the usual run or swim.
