


#### THIS MONTH'S COMPETITION



# OTHER EVENTS

#### KARRIMOR INTERNATIONAL MOUNTAIN MARATHON - 1990

A beautiful setting at Kinloch Rannoch was spoiled slightly by the persistent rain over the weekend. However, not even the rain could ruin it!

After several stops all over the country we all set off from Crewe station in the Renault Espace (bags of room). We stopped off at Penrith where John Broadhead, my partner, recommended the chippie where you could get superb chip butties and cumberland sausage and chips, unsure which to choose I bought them both followed by 'millionaires shortbread' from the bakers round the corner. PIG:

Being expert orienteers we deliberately missed our turning at the Pass of Killiecrankie and chose the much more scenic (longer) route through Glen Errochty. We found a little tea house in the middle of nowhere. The wee old wifey must have got the shock of her life as we descended on her. Everything in her house had tags on it including our seats and table - everything she owned was classified as antique and up for sale!!

Finally we made it, in the dark, to Loch Rannoch and the campsite. We pitched the spare tent and checked in! Then, off to the pub for a few beers and a hearty meal. Good preparation for the next two days <u>rambling</u> over the wee hills!

John and I had entered the SCORE EVENT which is best suited to orienteers. We took our time working out our route for Day 1 and decided to go for everything near by and leave ourselves an option at the far end depending on how we were doing.

When decision time came we decided to miss out the easy 70 point control and go for the 160 points to be had for climbing up the ridge near the finish. We had made the right choice as we crossed the finish in 5 hours 50 minutes (10 mins) to spare. We were obviously pleased with ourselves as we had visited all the controls except one. However 3 teams had visited all the controls and 14 teams had only missed one. Unfortunately our missing control was the most expensive and at the end of day 1 there were 40 other

teams with the same or more points than us. We camped and settled down to eat and drink everything we had except the breakfast food and the bars of chocolate and muesli for Day 2. Early rise, quick breakfast, pay a visit, pack away wet tent and off the start for Day 2 - 5 minutes to spare.

We decided on similar tactics for Day 2 and went for all the controls nearby and ran out of steam as we neared the finish area, just enough time to crawl up the path for a last 30 points before the final control at the finish - 4 hours 58 minutes (2 minutes to spare). Our timing had been perfect on both days.

We were surprised to find we had clawed our way up to 18th overall. Many of the pairs who had been ahead of us overnight opted for the long run (10 miles) on Day 2 to the far end, with no controls on the way, in order to pick up the controls with greater points. They obviously over estimated their fitness.

We bumped in to other DVO members who were as mad as us (you have to be mad to take part in a Mountain Marathon in Scotland at the end of October).

David Skidmore and Fiona Palmer - They have a habit of coming in late at Karrimors, losing valuable points but still scraping their certificate by hanging onto maximum of 250 points. This year was no exception with Dave and Fiona getting 240 points on Day 1, with only 10 points required on Day 2, they collected 100 points form the controls they visited but came in late and incurred 82 penalty points, hanging on to the certificate by 8 points (258pts).

John Armistead and Neil Forrest were 60th with 506 points (16th in Veteran Handicaps).
