

### EVENT REPORTS \*\*\*\*\*\*\*

NOC Relays. 11th May

It rained and it rained. The NOC Relays took place on a new area: Welbeck College. It was a mixture of parkland and patches of woodland. A number of interesting features were on the map, uncovered tunnels, all the various obstacles on the assault course, and numerous buildings. Unfortunately there are no maps available to consult, this is due to the control cards being part of the map and handed in at the finish.

"Handed in" may not be the most appropriate word. There were 10 legs on the long relay ranging from 1.1km to 2.7km in length. There was also a master-map system. As there were 10 different legs this would not have been too much of a problem, but, as mentioned earlier, it rained. Having to keep ten maps dry was bad enough before the start, but trying to draw up the master maps soon meant shouts of "Anyone got another pen?" and "It's easier to put a hole in the paper" resounding from the direction of the master maps. To make matters worse the map itself had the control card at the bottom of it and trying to punch the map and keep it dry became an exercise in itself. It is believed that the regional final will be against Borderliners in September, and then it's the final later in the autumn, with the two most dangerous clubs, AIRE and SYO, already behind us. We must be odds-on favourite now.

### Small Areas Development Programme

At present DVO have about 16 areas which are suitable for open events and of these 6 are suitable for Badge Events. The club has a firm commitment to remap these areas when necessary and continue to hold the popular open and badge events there. However there are a number of small areas within the county which seem to have orienteering potential, which we have not yet attempted to use. Your Friendly Fixtures sub-committee has recommended a development programme to seek access to and to map a few of these areas and use them for small events such as evening training and local weekend events with perhaps a limited number of colour-coded courses.

To further this idea we need volunteers for two types of activity:

#### A. Feasibility

Is the area suitable for orienteering? What are the boundaries? Who are the landowners? Will they give permission? Where can cars be parked?

#### B. Mapping

We are not expecting maps up to Longshaw or Chatsworth standards for these areas. Simple black/white or black/brown/white may well be sufficient. The lack of previous O maps to provide a base map is a drawback, but in general the areas should be suitable for novice mappers. Advice will be readily available from the experienced mappers in the club.

I am going to co-ordinate this programme, so anyone who would like to tackle either activity, or both, should contact me-Already Bill Woodward is investigating Stanton Moor and Paul Seaston Harboro Rocks. Rob Newton has volunteered for an area South of Derby. Other areas on my list are:
