As an "also ran" in a family of quite good orienteers I've often felt that I'm letting the side down by running SHORT. Though my navigation has improved over the years it still leaves a lot to be desired. My main problem has always been lack of stamina and an inability to keep running. However, Wednesday night training became a reality when I found someone who "ran" at my speed. What that training has done for me I'm not quite sure but Christina certainly has her hands full now!!

Over the last year I have run LONG at a few small Badge events (Benscliffe?) and gained not only Silver but Gold standard. Putting aside this year's British I have come third on SHORT at National 1 at Ewden Valley -pretty good considering I did it in climbing boots supporting a sprained ankle (courtesy of Robin Wood). National 2 at the Wrekin was also a success. Coming first at JK on Day 1 (don't ask about Day 2) proved to me that I could get my act together and that I should attempt LONG at a National.

National 3 at Eastbourne seemed like a fairly safe bet - not too technical. What I had not bargained for were the long path runs on which I became slower and slower. The final straw was when suffering brain death I left one control 180 degrees out and climbed an unnecessary hill! Never mind National 4 in Scotland couldn't be that bad, could it? To find 40 LONG combined with 35 LONG was bad enough but to see the declared length was 8.6 km was beyond belief. Slow and steady should have been the answer, but it didn't work for me. My aim had been to finish before Roz Clayton (I did have a 90 minute start on her), but I didn't. All that can be said is that I completed the course in under 3 hours - just!

And what of the future you ask? I shall swallow my pride gracefully and return to SHORT for Nationals. Local Badge events may tempt me into LONG, but never in the Lakes or Scotland.

Next year of course is quite a different story. Watch out JB and HP - your reign of glory nears its end!







# EVENTS GONE BY

#### Bow Wood

A glorious day and a good event. Blue 2 had a very interesting finish to the day. The early leading time of 56.14 set by David 'Superstar' Godfree was always in danger of being beaten thanks to the elephant tracks created by himself and the others who followed, reducing head high bracken to beautiful tracks leading straight to the controls.

As usual I had booked the last start time of 12:30, giving me time to Shadow Heather round the Yellow and Catherine time to get round the Green.

On my way to the start their seemed to be quite a few quality orienteers heading in the same direction and as it transpired there was a race on our hands with DVO members going off every minute from 12:26, but that wasn't the worst - John Hawkins had bribed registration to give him a start time of 12:31 (1 minute behind me) - I THINK HE SHOULD BE DISQUALIFIED - What do you think?

Anyway, off we went, one by one. The only hiccup early on was Steve Kimberley shouting at start officials trying to work out whether he should be copying down BLUE1 or BLUE2. With my speedy copying of the controls and quick getaway to the first control (having watched which way they all headed off), I caught the first minute up very quickly but it took until about control 6 before I caught the 2 minutes up on Steve. Then I couldn't get passed him and he pulled further away on our way down to number 8 as I slowed down going through the nettles (the only thing that brings me to a halt). Oh, I forgot to mention, I did my usual trick and headed off for number 10 instead of number 6 when I left checkpoint 5. Fortunately I was curious enough to double check my route when I saw Steve running off up the hill going in the wrong direction??????

Anyway, back to the race. Steve kept the pace up and I struggled to keep with him until we took slightly different routes into 12, Steve choosing to stay on the path longer before jumping in to find the track. It was also at this point that John Hawkins appeared on the scene. It had taken him a while to catch us up, but I later found out he had botched number 3 by overshooting, what a wally - there was a huge elephant track straight into it!

John and I both punched 12 together and quickly dived out before Steve and the others got to us. We then went hell for leather down the slope, a beautiful piece of forest. We went into 13 together and then took different routes to 14 (the second master maps). As expected, my route choice was far superior to that of John's and I slipped ahead by about 20 seconds at 14. With speedy copying again I was up and away while John was dipping his quill in his bottle of ink. Spot on to 15 before John could catch me but then, what a struggle getting through the fight to 16. When I eventually appeared through the other end of the fight I saw John in the distance trotting up the hill. I didn't see him again until I was going into 17 and then when I

arrived in the area of 18. He and many others were running about like headless chickens looking for the elusive crag. I then saw John head off like lighting in a weird direction. All of this threw me, good excuse, and I too got completely confused. I had been within 5 metres of the control, but subsequently took another 3-4 minutes to find it. Succeeding only by running down to the path relocating off a depression, with a control in it, running along the path to a boulder and then coming back into the forest finding the crag spot on. While all this was going on Steve & Co. caught me up and he had been heading straight for the control when he saw me run off in a different direction and this threw him off as well.

Having found the control I quickly and quietly crept away without anyone noticing me but in my desperation did the usual trick, for the second time on this course and missed out 19 and went straight to 20. Unfortunately this meant a trek back uphill to 19 and then back to 20. 21 & 22 were easy and John was waiting at the finish for me. He had won the day by a good 7 minutes from me in second and David Godfree, with a good early run, a further 2 minutes behind and Steve a further 2 minutes behind in 5th place.

An excellent day out, but I still say John should be disqualified!

#### Whitesprings

I arrived full of confidence knowing Whitesprings was an area I'd run on many times, planned on even. That confidence survived the knowledge that this was going to be a map memory Norwegian event. It did not survive the first control. It took me three return visits to that control to realise that I'd been holding the next section of map upside down and was looking for a control to the North rather than the South. No wonder I hadn't noticed a pond there on past visits. I settled down for a long evening.

Things did improve but not much. I managed to restrict my return visits to single memory refreshers. Matters were not helped by the Forestry Commission's policy rendering all of DVO's maps out of date (witnessed also at Shining Cliff only the Wednesday before) by clearing vast areas of runnable forest (what a ridiculous idea, to chop trees down).

As, one by one, I met others retiring, having failed to survive the challenge of Control 11, I realised that the only way I was going to score any league points was to complete the course regardless of the time. And so it came to pass that, at approaching half-past eight, a lonely and bedraggled figure struggled forlornly into the finish, urged on by the unnecessary ironic applause of a few heartless individuals - some of whom, it must be stressed, had not even had the willpower or competence to find No. 11 (had you Chris).

Many thanks to Ranald and Viv MacDonald for an evening that was more memorable than the control sites were.

On a more serious note, I had a good look at the results for this event - produced within 48 hours by Sleve Kimberley - and, whilst this is only the second event of the summer, I did wonder what the purpose of the handicapping system was and whether it was achieving it. Because of the previous week's handicap, Alasiair Buckley was relegated to 3rd rather than 2nd equal, whilst Paul Wright was demoted from 6th to 7th. Everyone else remained unaffected by handicapping. This is hardly radical and I suspect that the same old faces will feature in the same old order at the end of the summer.

What is needed is something much more drastic - a greater handicap factor, 50% for the winner perhaps, or a constant handicap applies to each individual throughout the season as in the club champs, or a greater element of luck in the events themselves, something, anything that will upset the status quo and give greater interest and incentive to all club members. This might even result in greater participation levels. The Hawkins of this world will still continue to win their Brown & Badge Courses but why should they have it all their own way in the summer league as well?
