Some tips for registration and start officials.

This article explains how the registration and start officials can make things easier for the finish and results officials at DVO club standard events. Most of you will know it all already but some of you don't:

The registration official should have a list of start times available on each course and tick off times as they are allocated, to prevent giving the same time to more than one competitor. It is also a good idea to record the competitors club on this list. Experienced competitors will not want a start time within four minutes of another runner from the same club. Beginners may be allowed to run in pairs on colour coded courses, but if they wish to run individually then they should be encouraged to take start times at least four minutes from their friends. There is no need to record competitors names on the start lists.

The registration official should write the start time allocated on the control card and also on the stub. Where there are three spaces on the card for the time enter hours and minutes and leave the rightmost space free, below the seconds space for finish time. Yes, we time in hours minutes, and seconds and not dys, hours and minutes. The competitor should be instructed to fill in his or her name, club, and age class, both on the card and on the stub. The information on the card will eventually be used in the compilation of results. The information on the stub shows us who has gone out into the forest and, if they come back, the stub will probably be used for display of on-the-day results.

BOF age classes are not easy to explain to beginners and I think DVO could do with a board explaining them. It is important that all club members who wish to be ranked in the East Midlands Gallopen do show their correct age class. Strictly speaking the lowest age classes are M10 and W10 but often parents like to record the exact ages of their infant prodigies eg. M6 and this is quite alright.

The start official should collect the stubs and ensure that each has a name on. Where the stub has no name the official should ask the competitor to complete the stub, and should also check that there is a name on the card. Where the competitor arrives late a new start time may be allocated, but the change must be shown clearly on both stub and card. Vague crossings out on top of a layer of transpaseal are not acceptable. The stubs should be kept in order - firstly sorted by colour and then, for each colour, in order of start time and all the same way up. They will be taken in batches to the finish tent.

Derbyshire Round Relay

Obviously some team members may be injured or otherwise unavailable on the day so I would still like to hear from anyone - particularly juniors - who is prepared to be a reserve. I would also like to hear from anyone who could help out with transport on the day. I am assuming that all two adult families will be able to arrange their own transport. I will try to co-ordinate transport arrangements for the others.

The majority of team members have already been given maps of their legs and I will ensure that all maps are distributed by the end of April. Everyone must survey their leg in advance. The route follows rights of way or is across open access land and you are expected to follow the route as closely as possible and not cut corners or take alternative road routes. If you find difficulty in following the marked route please let me know.

The schedules given below are only very approximate and no-one should be worried if they can't achieve their individual schdule. On the day, please could early runners ring my parents on Matlock (0629) 55338 after completing their legs so that later runners can find out when they are likely to be rquired.

A post event social will be held at the Derwent Rowing Club which is on the west bank of the Derwent about 800 metres north of Derby Cathedral. NB. All team members should pay the entry fee of 25p to me.
