

TIPS FOR MOVICES


I've got some bad news for our new members - unless you are a one-in-a-thousand "natural" - you will find in the early years (yes, years!) almost as many ways of losing time as you find controls. There isn't much anyone can do to help except suggest a few ways you can help yourself.

1. Dealing with the paper work: - take a map case, preferably a heavy gauge poly bag (Reminds me of a school pupil who turned up with a black one, not realising what it was needed for.). Control card: put this in small poly bag and pin it to your top garment. Description list: this can be dispensed with if you copy codes and descriptions into the appropriate box on your control card. You will need to abbreviate descriptions, and don't forget to write them upside down if you are pinning the card to your top. (I always put the description list in my pocket so I have a check against clerical errors.) Always tape up the map case to stop the map falling out. Don't use ex-army type map cases - it is important to be able to fold the map up small so you can "thumb" your position. Many people put red arrows all over the map to show north even when the map is scrawed up. You are recommended to keep map and control card separate so you don't have to unfold the map at every control. Don't forget to look for map corrections and ask if you don't see them.

- 2. The start and master maps: Look where north is while you're waiting, and fit the map to the ground in the vicinity of the start. Look particularly at the contours and see where other starters are heading. Look at the master map layout board near the start. Mark up your master map very carefully a mistake here has to be avoided at all costs. For each control look for a large feature near the control to find approximate location, eg lake, clearing, prominent junction; find this on your map, look back to master map to find the feature; put pen on the spot, and check back to the master map; if correct circle the feature, taking care not to obscure other detail néarby; check back to master map again. I would always recommend numbering the controls (not inside the circle, but nearby on a blank piece of map) and joining the controls with a line. And don't neglect to mark the triangle from the master map; wherever you're going you need to know where you are now.
- 3. On the course. Always keep your map ORIENTATED (This is the main use of the compass for the novice). This means the north edge pointing north. Only if you're travelling north should you have the map the "right way up". If travelling east, north is on your left, etc.



When you reach a junction where you are turning, remember to turn the map as you turn so that it remains orientated. When you map is orientated a line drawn from your position to your destination will, when extended off the map, go to your destination, thus:



Note that O-maps always show magnetic north to facilitate bearings.

Try to keep tabs on where you are all the time - walk before trying to run. Feedback from ground to map is vital for checking position. By this I mean

look around continually and try to check off the things you see against what you should be passing if you are right.

Don't try to go straight on a compass bearing from control to control. Use the compass to keep the map orientated and map-read. Use the paths and other hand-rails (ie line features like fences, streams, walls). On orange courses and above, you will have some controls on point features such as boulders and depressions. Here the best technique is to choose a nearby ATTACK POINT eg a track junction and then perhaps use a bearing to the control.

Always check control codes against the description list for your course.

Try not to loiter near the control - this will only attract other competitors. If you get lost and want to retire, DON'T PANIC! Don't blow your whistle unless injured and in need of rescue. If you must, ask someone how to get get back, but don't expect someone who is running flat out to stop for you. By orientating the map you can usually see which direction would take you to, say the forest edge or a road. But remember, fields are nearly always out-of bounds, and trespassing could jeopardise future events.

4. After the event: Remember to fill in a results envelope (and pay for it!), usually near registration. Introduce yourself to other DVO members, they are on the whole almost human and not too haughty with newcomers. If you ask for advice they'll probably be flattered, and you'll not be able to get rid of them. If it's a DVO event offers of help with the results (and even collecting the controls) may be well-received and are a sure-fire way of getting to know the old hands. When you get home mark up your route on the map and see where you went wrong. If you're part of an 'O' family go over the courses with each other and learn from one another.
