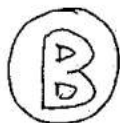

TOTLEY TERMINATOR

18 miles (or 30km) 3000' climb (or 1000m) - The Totley TERMINATOR. This was supposed to be a mere fell race around the gentle undulating peak district west of Sheffield. Little did I realise that this would be the ultimate test of my navigational skills, in my life :-

The morning of the race :- John Hopper rings up and shocks me with the news, not that he was actually to travel up with his family!, but that we had to use a map, and NAVIGATE around the route. He proceeded to give me a set of grid references over the phone. This was fine, I can navigate on a map with grid references. But when we arrived at the event I was yet again shocked. Black and white photocopies, no contours, and a line to follow! By now I was really worried. You expect me to navigate on that! Ok, Calm Down! Think Quickly! There must be some way to do this. In an instant it came to me. There was a way - BOF Junior Tour 92. I had the ultimate Orienteering Skills at my disposal (Thanks to EMOA) I could complete the TERMINATOR.

We set off slowly at first. I remembered the Tour, 'Always take No. one steady, you don't want to blow it at the start.'. The top of Burbage Moor gave us our next vital decision. 'Route choice is vital, don't follow the rest, asses the situation and take the best route for you.'. We did just that and came out on top. Only, unfortunately, to lose all the places gained on Burbage by being given wrong directions just before Rivlin. Again the flashbacks saved us 'So, you've made a mistake, don't panic, try to pull back time gradually.'. We did just this and by the top of Stanedge we were back in contention and going well.



Down the hill, through Hathersage and, Disaster!. "Lack of concentration can be a major contributory factor to many mistakes." The path just seemed to peter out and I was left in a field wondering where I was. "To relocate try to remember where you have been. Use both Map to ground, and ground to map techniques." I looked around, calm as ever, and there on the horizon I saw the competitors I had just overtaken 20 minutes previous. "If all else fails, HEADLESS CHICKEN IT." I steamed back up the hill and re-overtook some very puzzled faces. Up the hill, down the hill, and carry on down the hill.

Having lost all faith in the map my technique now was to FOLLOW and hope they know where they're going. They didn't! We were confronted by someone who did though. The comment was, "HE HE HE, HA HA HA YOU'VE GONE THE WRONG WAY." Another flashback saved me "It's bad publicity to hit spectators". Another headless chicken act pulled me back up the hill and past the very puzzled local contingent for a 3rd time. "The run in can be the difference between winning and losing a race". I took my advice and basically sprinted the last 4km back down the hill into Totley thankful I had not been completely terminated. I was also glad to see that the advice we were given on Tour does work, as the man who was dishing it out won!
